On the 11th of November, 1775, he wrote from Cambridge, in Massachusetts, to the President of Congress, enclosing a copy of an act then just passed by the Council and House of Representatives of that Province, for the establishment of a Prize Court, and he added: Should not a court be established by authority of Congress, to take cognizance of prizes made by the Continental vessels? Whatever the mode is which they are pleased to adopt, there is an absolute necessity of its being speedily determined on. This letter was communicated to Congress on Friday, the 17th day of the same November, whereupon it was Resolved, That...
